



AVID Elementary Foundations is designed for educators who work directly with students to develop their academic skills, specifically students who are becoming independent learners. It is intended to support the embedding of AVID strategies across an entire grade level and supporting articulation and calibration of strategies and delivery across an entire site. Providing elementary students an opportunity to develop strong metacognitive, collaborative, and processing skills allows them to better understand and utilize content information.


The core of *AVID Foundations* is WICOR (Writing to Learn, Inquiry, Collaboration, Organization, Reading to Learn). Foundations classrooms are designed to develop and build academic skills in all core content areas as students are learning to reflect on their own learning. In addition, this book will be a staple that is used across all grade levels at a Primary school.



Bridges to Success

AVID Bridges to Success provide teachers with proven, research-based strategies to help their students learn content more successfully, as well as develop the metacognitive skills necessary for success at university and in their careers. The strategies can be implemented in any content-area classroom or as part of a schoolwide initiative. In addition, these resources are designed to be developmentally appropriate for 5th- to 8th-grade students.

The resources and topics included within AVID Bridges to Success support students as they develop their writing through focused note-taking and learning logs, their use of inquiry through Philosophical Chairs and Socratic Seminar, their use of collaboration through collaborative structures, their organisation of materials and time, and their critical reading skills, as well as providing resources to support student empowerment.





Organizing the AVID Student Binder

To illustrate the importance and contents of the AVID student binder, Organizing the AVID Binder, Teacher's Guide has been created. The materials and ideas compiled here have come from feedback from a survey of AVID staff and teachers. This book, by design, does not replicate what an AVID student binder looks like. The primary goal of this book is to provide a foundation for how to establish the AVID student binder in the AVID elective class and should be used primarily by AVID elective teachers for this purpose.


AVID elective teachers are also encouraged to use this book to educate other staff members on the philosophy and methodologies of AVID and

what is expected of AVID elective students at each grade level to ensure their success in school.

There are four sections of this book: Binder Overview, Cornell Notes and Learning Logs, Tutorials, and Time Management. The **Binder Overview** section provides information about the structure, contents, and requirements for the binder at each grade level from grade 6–12. This section also includes rubrics and grade sheets to be used for grading the binder.


Section two, **Cornell Notes and Learning Logs,** shows how to teach students to take Cornell Notes and reflect in Learning Logs in all subject areas. In addition, this section provides samples of Cornell notes. Section three, **Tutorials**, explains how tutorial participation and notes are recorded as part of the binder grade.

Finally, section four, **Time Management**, covers how to teach students to use weekly and monthly calendars to prioritize their time and organized themselves.



AVID Family Workshops with Handouts and Slides Download Link



Five workshops are offered at each level; most are 90 minutes long. The workshops build on each other so that very little information is duplicated.




AVID Tutorial Guide and AVID Tutor Workbook with AVID Tutorial Activity Guide and AVID Tutorial Support Video Download Link



Supporting Math in the AVID Elective with Student Guide Download Link






AVID Academic Language and Literacy

The strategies within this resource—along with the supplemental resources online and professional learning opportunities—will





AVID Writing for Disciplinary Literacy: A Schoolwide Approach


AVID Writing for Disciplinary Literacy: A Schoolwide


The Write Path English Language Arts: Informing Ourselves and Others, Through Writing and Speaking Teacher Guide with Student Guide Download Link

Other writing sections within these resources focus on Writing to Learn and On-Demand Writing. The second section focuses on Oral Language and presents strategies for listening, presentations, discussions, debates, speeches, and performances. Each section presents strategies, teacher tips, and ideas for classroom implementation and differentiation.




The Write Path History/Social Science: Interactive Teaching and Learning, Teacher Guide with Student Guide Download Link


The Write Path 1 Science Teacher Guide directs educators in applying AVID's WICOR strategies within the science classroom to support students' thinking, problem-solving, processing of information, and organisational skills as they make sense of seemingly difficult scientific concepts. Throughout the book, the Interactive Notebook is used as an organisational tool for student thinking and learning.

The activities are written as lessons or investigations educators can use in their classrooms to scaffold students' learning and engage them in the wonder of science. The activities include lab investigations, inquiry processes, reading strategies, and writing to learn tools. Of particular value are the processing activities that offer students options on how to write, display, and explain the thinking that led to their understanding of scientific concepts.
