MyAVID is the AVID world's secure, online community—a dynamic contact and organisational management system run by AVID Center in the USA.

Through MyAVID you will be able to access over 40 years of primary and secondary research-based teaching and learning resources.

This guide will:


- show you how to register for MyAVID

How to register for MyAVID

1. Go to https://my.avid.org/register_welcome.aspx.
2. Click on [Create a MyAVID account](#).




3. Select your **Organization type** from the drop-down list.




Collaboration centers on the effective sharing of information amongst individuals. In an educational context, collaboration affords students the opportunity to work with peers in various group configurations as they engage with subject matter across content areas. Collaboration is essential for student success as it entails experiencing the challenges and opportunities associated with a diversity of perspectives and working styles, which can deepen metacognitive thinking, accelerate learning, and broaden perspective. Utilizing collaborative structures to provide students with the opportunity to work with different peers—from diverse backgrounds and with varying experiences—strengthens not only the class community, but enriches the learning experience for every student involved.

Using these resources, educators will be able to:

- Create a community using collaborative structures.
- Explain how collaboration supports and honors student differences that benefit the classroom community.
- Engage students in creating and monitoring the norms for successful collaboration.
- Develop students' abilities to utilize collaborative structures.



The 4 A's (adopt, adapt, accelerate, advocate)
The 4A's® is a holistic view of technology in classrooms and can be integrated with any other educational technology framework, providing educators an understanding of the role of technology within specific educational contexts. The 4 A's are incorporated into the WAG to support teachers in using digital tools, especially in virtual classrooms.



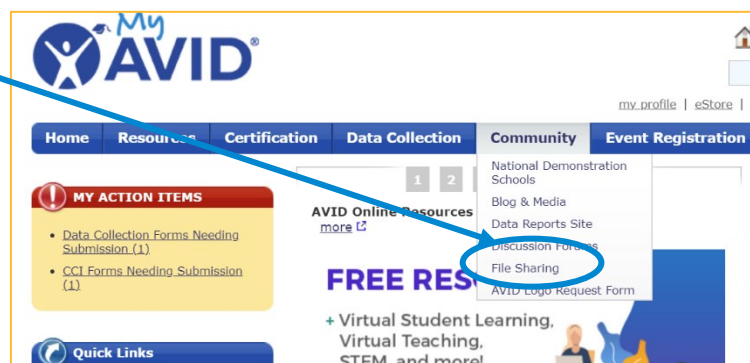
